Main moral themes – suggested responses

- **Love** Jesus demonstrates his love for his friends in washing feet and his love for all as he accepts his arrest.
- **Forgiveness** Jesus forgives those who betray and deny him.
- **Empathy** Jesus healed the soldiers ear because he was in pain, even though he had come as an enemy to Jesus. This also demonstrates forgiveness and love.
- **Justice** rather, injustice. Jesus had not committed any crime to be arrested for.
- **Loyalty** rather, disloyalty. His friends did not show loyalty to him when the situation became difficult.

Main emotional themes – suggested responses

- **Anger** Jesus was angry that a place of worship had been turned into a corrupt marketplace where poor people were exploited and prayer was not being kept sacred.
- **Guilt** Judas and Peter experience feeling guilt and shame for the way that they behaved towards Jesus.
- **Sadness** Jesus felt sad about the situation that was about unfold. He felt sad about the broken relationship between people and God and about the fact that he was going to die.

The messages of the Easter story – suggested responses

Jesus washes the feet of his disciples.	<p>Christians believe Jesus is a humble leader. Jesus is showing love and kindness and doing something that a leader would not usually do. Christians respond by being loving towards others and being willing to serve and help without being selfish.</p> <p>NB: This act of sacrifice is something that will repeat in greater form in the next events of the Easter story and be one of the most significant messages for Christians.</p>
Jesus predicts Judas' betrayal and Peter's denial of him.	<p>Christians believe that because Jesus is the Son of God he knows what is going to happen in the future with Judas and Peter. Jesus does not respond by trying to change this, he accepts that everything is under God's control. Christians believe that it was wrong for his friend to deny knowing him.</p> <p>Christians respond by trusting God with their current and future situations and by not denying what they believe in front of others who disagree.</p>
Jesus is full of sorrow as he goes to pray in the garden.	<p>Christians believe that Jesus was sad because he knew what was about to happen to him (that he was going to die). Christians believe Jesus was talking to God and asking him for help and strength to get through the situation, not get out of the situation.</p> <p>Christians respond in thankfulness to Jesus for being willing to go through what he did (believing it was for their benefit). And they respond by praying to God about all life situations and accepting them.</p>
Jesus is calm when he is being arrested in the garden.	<p>Christians believe Jesus was calm because he trusted and accepted that this was what needed to happen in God's plan to mend the broken relationship with people (as mentioned in video).</p> <p>Christians respond by adopting an attitude of trust and acceptance in the circumstances of life. And, again, they respond in gratitude as they believe that Jesus accepted the arrest to address the relationship between people and God.</p>
