



Prayer Walk

Things to look for - be inspired to pray...

Bus stops - pray for pupils who travel a distance.

Shops: Give thanks for all we have. Pray that in the midst of so much materialism we would see that everything is passing away but God is eternal.

'Clearway' signs. Pray that God's Word would have a clear road into school. Give thanks for the many open doors there are through assemblies, classes, SU groups.

'Humps'/speedbumps sign - Pray for those struggling today- for those who recently have been through upsetting and difficult times. Pray that they would know God's love and care.

Electric road signs: think about the warnings God gives us to keep us on the right path. Warnings about ignoring His Word. Pray for our friends that they would take seriously the Gospel message and heed God's voice.

Bridge: Thank God for Jesus and his work on the Cross, the One who bridges the gap between a holy God and rebels like us.

'Camera' sign: Remember that God is watching over us all the time. Jesus goes with us into school and His Spirit will help and guide.

Churches - Pray that their influence in schools would be positive. Give thanks for the groups that run for young people which can introduce them to Jesus and to His people. (Sunday schools, Bible Classes etc.)

Roundabout - Pray for those who hear about Jesus but see many different ways to go and become distracted, Pray that they would know that Jesus is the way, the truth and the life.

Petrol Station - Where do we get our energy from? How will we manage to stay on the right path? Ask God to give us a desire to know Him better through the Bible.

As you pray you might want to leave your mark with some chalk...CHALK! (NOT PEN OR SPRAY PAINT OR CARVED WITH A KNIFE)

Draw a fish sign at the street corners - it signifies 'Jesus is the Son of God, Saviour'

Or the sign of the cross - you could turn the following verses into prayers...

Colossians 2:14

'...having canceled the written code, with its regulations, that was against us and that stood opposed to us; he took it away, nailing it to the cross.'

Hebrews 12:2

Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.

On lampposts - you could mark a fish, a cross or what about a flame?

Matthew 5:14

"You are the light of the world. A city on a hill cannot be hidden.

Matthew 5:16

In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven.

John 3:19

This is the verdict: Light has come into the world, but men loved darkness instead of light because their deeds were evil.

John 8:12

When Jesus spoke again to the people, he said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."

2 Corinthians 4:6

For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," made his light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ.
