

How to leave a gift

After providing for your loved ones, please consider leaving a gift in your will to SU Scotland. Your gift will bless future generations and provide a legacy of hope which enables many more children and young people to discover God's love for them.

Leaving a legacy is a simple process:

1. Decide what you would like to bequest—you may choose to leave a percentage of your estate (which protects gifts from financial fluctuations) or a specific amount.
2. Ask your solicitor to write or update your will. They can also advise you or amend an existing will if you want to include a bequest to SU Scotland, quoting our charity number (SC011222).

Don't have a will yet? A will is important! A will gives you reassurance that the people and causes you care about most will be looked after. Making a will requires time and thought, but once you've decided what you want to do, preparing your will is straightforward.

If you have not yet made a will, then we are delighted to offer a **FREE** will service in partnership with Balfour+Manson solicitors who will prepare a free, basic will for SU Scotland supporters.

Complex instructions or estates will incur fees at a discounted rate. You are under no obligation to leave a gift to SU Scotland when using the free will service, but we would be delighted if you would consider doing so.
